PATROLMEN & SAFETY REPORT

Message from the Patrolmen: Tim Zradicka and Dennis Tharp

SECOND REQUEST: The EMS & first responders have commented that many of our houses are hard to find and are not clearly identifiable. Camp Creek has marked main roads with green reflective signs identifying "groups" of addresses, but some addresses are not clear. **Emergency personnel** have requested that each lot have the **Physical Address** and the **Lot Number** clearly posted at the entrance of your lot. The Patrolmen are also requesting that lot owners put reflective numbers on their boat docks. It is very difficult to respond to emergencies or calls when addresses and boat houses are not clearly marked.

The biggest concern is Lot Owners are violating boat, PWC & ATV registration rules. They are not registering new vehicles or tagging them with lot numbers. The Board approved implementing procedures to write Violation Tickets for lot owners who violate registration rules.

Water Safety

Life jackets are required for all tubers, skiers and anyone being pulled behind a watercraft. A \$250.00 fine will be assessed for those not wearing a life jacket as required!

- Refrain from alcohol when operating a boat or jet ski.
- Do not pull tubes with people on them down the channels.
- · Boats and jet skis must travel in a counterclockwise direction in the ski area.
- Stay in boat lanes when possible.
- No swimming at the boat ramps.
- Be mindful and courteous to others on the lake.
- Please remember all boats and jet skis must be registered and tagged.
- Only annual permit holder registered watercraft are allowed on the lake.
- Guests and children over 18 need a pass while on the lake if they are not with a lot owner.
- The lake has many stumps so please travel in the boat lanes and be cautious in the water
- Be careful swimming as hydrilla can be a safety hazard.
- Stumps can be removed for \$200/each by calling Josh Havel 979-492-9112.

Fire Safety

- The burn piles have cameras and are monitored by the patrolmen and the Office.
- Please observe no dumping signs and do not light the burn piles yourself. We must notify the TCEQ (Texas Commission on Environmental Quality) prior to any burning and have Easterly Volunteer Fire Department monitor while burning. Any unauthorized burning at these locations may jeopardize our burn permits.
- Hydrilla clippings must be piled separately from the wood to allow them to dry so please put them to the side of any wood pile.
- · Approved materials include tree and wood products only without nails or screws!
- No household trash, plastic or glass of any type can be dumped!

OIL & GAS

Gas production is steady, but the price of natural gas has fallen to under \$3 so we are estimating a shortfall in revenue of approximately \$100k. Comstock started to pull water on July 5th from the West End boat ramp. They have completed the water draw with no further draws planned this year. Estimated revenue is \$300k. This will help offset the gas revenue shortage we are facing.

FINANCE

We are fully funded for the budget this year from low owner's dues with 96% paid. We have only 19 Lot owners still have not paid annual permit dues and registered letters have been sent out. The Finance Committee recommendation is to stay the course and continue with the current Investment Policy with Merrill Lynch as the account is earning 4.9% and we will continue to review the status of the account on a quarterly basis. Financial Policies & Procedures Manual is starting to be developed by the Accounting Firm, Thompson, Derrig and Craig who will document corporate financial controls & procedures.

DAM & RECREATION AREA

SPECIAL PROJECTS

BURN PILES: We have cameras at each of the 3 Camp Creek burn piles which are monitored by the patrolmen and the Office. The burn piles are for lot owners only and are for trees and other vegetation (hydrilla) and wood with no nails, screws or other metal. They are not for household trash, plastic, glass, etc.

Once the piles get big enough, we have staff burn the piles under the supervision of the Easterly Volunteer Fire Department.

PHYSICAL ADDRESSES: The Emergency Medical Services personnel and 1st responders have commented that many of our houses are hard to find and are not clearly identifiable. Emergency personnel have requested that each lot have the physical address and the lot number clearly posted at the entrance of your lot.

The the lake patrolmen have agreed to order a sign for you if you would like. You can call him at the patrolman number or call and leave word at the Office.

CPR TRAINING: Robertson County EMS conducted CPR Training and we had 25 participants. We may look into additional training for fire prevention, water, boat and jet ski safety.

WILDLIFE

HOGS: There is no easy solution to the ongoing hog problem around the lake. As most of us can see, they have again moved into the area as evidenced by the rooting's on the sides of our roads and venturing onto several lots. During this time of year, they are sometimes seen in the mornings and evenings before dark on the edges of our roads. If while driving you do see hogs, please feel free to call our Patrolman on duty, 979-906-8064. If possible, we will try and relocate a pig or two.

NUTRIA: The Nutria population has increased significantly over time, and they are causing problems around the lake along with Beavers, by clogging culverts as an example. Additionally, they will chew through electrical wiring and on wood decking on boat houses. They, like the hogs, are an invasive species and are in essence, a large water rat. Texas Parks & Wildlife encourages the elimination of Nutria to help control their numbers. Lot owners are allowed to take Nutria from their lots, (Rule; 25.7) and are encouraged to do so safely. Below is a picture of the common Nutria.
